





Over 800 people engaged in the arts during the 17th annual Maud Powell Arts Celebration in Peru, Illinois held the weekend of August 20–21. MPS board member Chris Coughlin, leading an enthusiastic team of volunteers, organized the event with the cooperation and support of the City of Peru and other major donors. The event celebrates Maud Powell's birth in the City of Peru in August and was begun after the City dedicated an 8-foot bronze statue of her near City Hall in 1995.





Chris Coughlin Receives Maud Powell Society Award

Chris Coughlin was the recipient of the Maud Powell Society Award on August 20 during the Maud Powell Arts Celebration in Peru, Illinois. The award was presented to Coughlin in recognition of her dedication to the artistic and humanitarian ideals of the pioneering American violinist Maud Powell. It is The Maud Powell Society for Music and Education's highest honor.

Coughlin took over the reins of the Maud Powell music festival in Peru in 2009, renamed it the Maud Powell Arts Celebration and began working diligently to rejuvenate it. Particularly committed to its educational purpose, Coughlin has recruited an army of volunteers and supporters who have carried out her vision for the event.

She has increased the participation of young people and Illinois Valley residents of all ages in this celebration of the arts and of Maud Powell's inspiring legacy.

Coughlin continues to enrich the programs and heighten interest in the Maud Powell Arts Celebration which has been a significant event in the life of the Illinois Valley for 17 years.

Rachel Barton Pine Presents Souvenir Poster to the Maud Powell Society



Rachel Barton Pine surprised MP Society president Karen Shaffer with a souvenir poster of the Illinois Philharmonic Orchestra's re-creation of the historic concert in which Maud Powell played the Beethoven concerto with Gustav Mahler and the New York Philharmonic. The original, ground-breaking all-Beethoven concert took place in Carnegie Hall, New York City, on December 31, 1909.

Pine appeared as the soloist as she and guest conductor Alexander Platt re-created one of the "supreme moments" of Maud Powell's career. IPO board president Dr. Charles Amenta described Pine's performance as "Triumphant! Exultant! Ravishing! and Radiant!" The impressive souvenir poster has been proudly hung in the new Maud Powell Society library room. "It is a perfect expression of Maud Powell's vital legacy that Rachel Barton Pine continues to bring to life for audiences throughout the world," Shaffer said as she gratefully acknowledged the beautiful gift.





Maud Powell Among Carnegie Hall Treasures

Two of Maud Powell's legendary appearances in Carnegie Hall have been included in *Carnegie Hall Treasures* by Tim Page and Carnegie Hall, published by Harper Design in 2011. The beautifully appointed volume is "a keepsake of a beautiful and noble place in the midst of America's largest city." It tells the story of this beloved hall mostly in images, one of which is the advertisement for Maud Powell's famous Carnegie Hall recital on January 8, 1917, in which she played a popularly chosen program of music she had recorded. The image was provided by The Maud Powell Society. On another page, the text above an image of Jean Sibelius's autograph notes the "pathbreaking American virtuoso violinist Maud Powell" gave the American premiere of the Finnish composer's violin concerto in Carnegie Hall in 1906.

Maud Powell's long association with Carnegie Hall included her historic Beethoven and Mendelssohn concerto performances with Gustav Mahler and the New York Philharmonic in 1909. The Beethoven concert was recently re-created by the Illinois Philharmonic Orchestra with violinist Rachel Barton Pine.

Maud Powell Inspires Young People



Elise Fellows White — A Violinist’s Memoir

A significant memoir by Elise Fellows White, a fine violinist contemporary with Maud Powell, has been devotedly compiled by her grandson Dr. Houghton M. White from her autobiography, diaries, letters and photographs. *A Maine Prodigy: The Life and Adventures of Elise Fellows White* recounts the life of this gifted woman who studied at the New England Conservatory and privately with Franz Kneisel before studying with his teacher Jakob Grün in Vienna. She made her New York debut appearing with Lillian Nordica (née Norton) in 1896 and undertook an extensive tour throughout Canada and the American Midwest and Northwest. Her struggle to maintain a musical life in the face of extreme hardship is a moving story of courage and perseverance. The well-illustrated book is published by The Maine Historical Society (2011) and available at www.mainehistory.org. Dr. White has donated his grandmother’s papers to the Maine Historical Society.

A Message from the Maud Powell Society's President

Dear Friends,

Since our 25th anniversary year has just drawn to a close, I have taken some time to reflect on all that we have accomplished. The journey has been challenging, exciting and ultimately fulfilling. When we began Maud Powell's name was known only to a few but now it is known throughout the world. Our greatest accomplishments have been the publication of Maud Powell's biography, her reissued recordings, and *Maud Powell Favorites*, an edition of her transcriptions, editions, original compositions, and music dedicated to her—thus establishing enduring records of her achievements which are now available worldwide.

These have spawned renewed appreciation for this great artist and awakening realization of her relevance and importance to us today. The Peru Maud Powell Arts Celebration that we founded testifies that Maud Powell's vibrant legacy is once again alive and well. We continue to see concerts by violinists like Rachel Barton Pine (along with her best-selling *American Virtuosa* CD) and numerous orchestras celebrating her contributions to America's musical life. While Maud has inspired young women to write dissertations and theses about her, the EYSO through its Maud Powell String Quartet carries forward her mission to encourage young people to engage in making music.

The Maud Powell Society's efforts have sparked lasting Maud Powell commemorations — Peru's 8 foot bronze statue of her, her induction into the Fox Valley Arts Hall of Fame, and the Smithsonian National Portrait Gallery's acceptance of Nicholas R. Brewer's oil portrait of her for its permanent collection in Washington, DC. We can be proud of these achievements — accomplished through the work of the Society with the generous support of our Friends.

We have moved steadily forward on all our projects through the years to re-establish Maud Powell's vital legacy and current relevance in the minds and hearts of people young and old throughout the world. Of course, I wish that we could have moved faster and done more but it was all we could do to continue moving forward without glancing backward with concern about our support for this work.

To move forward with faith, trusting that the necessary funds would be there for each project, has made this a challenging journey. While costs of each project have always been carefully calculated, we must keep in mind that the calculated costs of each project have not included compensation for my labor or that of our magazine's editor.

The support of our Friends is vital to our work. Everyone is receiving more appeals for donations than ever in this difficult time. And while food is critically important, Maud Powell would remind us that we do not live by bread alone. Inspiration for the human spirit is equally as important — the inspiration to live a creative and purposeful life that serves the highest aspirations of heart and soul.

At Peru's Maud Powell Arts Celebration I was moved to see how both young and more mature music students and dedicated teachers are striving to emulate Maud Powell's example while their families and friends surround them with their supportive presence and applause. I have tried so often to explain why Maud Powell matters but nothing can compare with these musicians' demonstrations of inspired endeavor to achieve the best that is in them.

I was delighted to give our Maud Powell PowerPoint presentation during the Celebration. At its conclusion as always, people took time to express their awe of her and her achievements. And they never fail to say how much Maud's story inspires them.

That is why I want to go forward with creating a stand-alone PowerPoint presentation that can be used in schools. And I want to create a full-fledged documentary for even wider audiences. Maud Powell's inspiration is for everyone, not just for musicians and music lovers. We can all learn important lessons from her story of courage, discipline, and perseverance in the face of immense odds.

I am currently working on the second edition of my 1988 Maud Powell biography as I have uncovered a good deal of new information with which to update the book. My work on this and other projects was waylaid this year due to the passing of both of my parents and my compromised eyesight. But I am slowly picking up where I left off and am happy again to be working on the biography. Every time I get back into Maud's programs, reviews, articles, music and recordings, I am moved to higher endeavor to share her inspiration with the whole world.

In putting together this newsletter, I was astonished to notice how many women in music we have featured in our magazine *Signature, Women in Music*.
